Paul C. Saunders is President of the International Rule of Law Project, which is part of the Bingham Centre in London. and an Honorary Senior Fellow of the British Institute of International and Comparative Law. He is Chair Emeritus of the New York State Judicial Institute on Professionalism in the Law. He is a Distinguished Visitor from Practice at Georgetown Law and has taught as an Adjunct Professor at the Elizabeth Haub Law School at Pace University and at the Securities and Exchange Commission. He is a Fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers.

Professor Saunders is a retired litigation partner at Cravath, Swaine & Moore LLP. He joined the firm in 1971, was a Partner from 1977 to 2010 and Of Counsel from 2010 to 2014. . He received an A.B. egregia cum laude from Fordham College in 1963, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa, a J.D. from Georgetown University Law Center in 1966, where he was Notes Editor of the Law Journal, and an M.S. in Global Affairs with distinction from New York University in 2017. He also holds a Certificat d'Études Politiques from l'Institut d'Études Politiques in Paris.

From 1967 to 1971, he was a Captain in the U.S. Army Judge Advocate General's Corps., where he was awarded the Meritorious Service Medal.
